一、活動宗旨

臺灣國家公園肩負保存與維護臺灣特殊自然人文環境與生物多樣性的重任，面對氣候變遷威脅與公民參與趨勢，國家公園經營管理亟需仰賴更多元廣泛的思辯與人才。本會成立宗旨係為促進國家公園相關之學術研究及推廣環境教育與自然保育工作，為激勵年輕世代關心並參與國家公園保育及經營管理，鼓勵創新思維，培育資源保育研究人才與專業，特辦理此活動。

六、活動內容說明

(一) 國家公園經營管理參訪研習暨青年論壇

聯合國《生物多樣性公約》設定2050願景為「人類與自然和諧共存」，國家公園兼負保育、遊憩與教育之責，如何在三者之間取得平衡一直是國家公園經營管理的主要課題，本活動將帶領與會者參訪見習擎天崗特別景觀區經營管理，並以「國家公園如何有效經營，以促進自然與人的和諧」作為論壇主題，邀請中央研究院退休研究員劉小如博士引言，和與會者對談交流，激發創新的保育行動與反思。

(二) 研究生論文競賽

本活動將徵求國內大專院校在學及109、110年應屆畢業之碩博士學生，撰寫國家公園相關之論文，經書面審查與口頭發表遴選表現傑出者，分別給予「特優」、「優選」、「佳作」等獎勵，會後將集結出版論文集，並鼓勵投稿《國家公園學報》。

七、參與對象

(一) 參訪研習

1. 各國家公園管理處40歲以下或3年內新進國家公園體系（不限年齡）之現職同仁。
2. 研究生論文競賽報名者（不限年齡）。
3. 40歲以下，對國家公園經營管理有興趣之社會大眾。
4. 如超過場地人數限制，以1、2類報名者優先錄取。

(二) 研究生論文競賽

1. 教育部核定設立之全臺各大專院校在學及109、110年應屆畢業之碩博士學生（含一般學位碩博士生、國際專班碩博士生、在職專班碩博士生）。
2. 專題研究領域為研究區域及內容與臺灣國家公園相關者。

(三) 論壇與研討會均開放一般民眾旁聽，採報名制，額滿為止。

八、活動時程與報名方式

- (一) 110年7月31日（六）前完成線上報名（<http://www.cnps.org.tw/>），參訪研習與論文競賽報名者將由本會進行資格審查後發送錄取通知。

- (二) 投稿論文競賽者請填妥投稿人基本資料，依序合併為一個PDF檔案，於截止日晚上12點前寄達投稿信箱taiwancnps@gmail.com，始完成報名程序。報名信件主題註明「參加國家公園研究生論文競賽」，報名檔案命名方式為「2021NP Thesis -姓名(全名)」；決選名單將於110年8月16日(一)公告於活動網站，同時以電話通知。

九、論文競賽類別：

- (一) 依研究領域分為「自然環境科學」、「人文社會科學」及「經營管理科學」等3類。
- (二) 每類組報名件數須達3件(含)以上方進行評選，未達3件者，每位參賽者頒與參賽獎及參賽證明1份。
- (三) 主辦單位得根據投稿件數調整組別。

十、論文競賽報名文件：

- (一) 基本資料表1份。
- (二) 畢業證書影本(畢業生)或學生證影本(在校生)。
- (三) 20頁以內完整論文(論文格式參見《國家公園學報》投稿須知)。
- (四) 報名參賽者需為論文第1作者。

十一、論文競賽評選標準：

- (一) 由主辦單位進行報名資格審查，合格者進入第2階段「書面論文」審查。
- (二) 參賽論文評分包括「書面論文審查」和「口頭發表」2部分；「書面論文審查」佔總分80%，「口頭發表」佔總分20%。
- (三) 書面論文審查過程一律以匿名方式處理，對於參選人之學校、系所及指導教授姓名等一律不公開，以保持論文審查之公平性。
- (四) 評分要點如下，總分相同者以書面論文審查成績決定優勝順序，若再有同分情形，以「對國家公園經營管理之重要性與貢獻」得分決定優勝順序：

書面論文審查	口頭發表
對國家公園經營管理之重要性與貢獻(60%)	現場簡報表現(50%)
論文之原創性與價值(40%)	發表應答(50%)

(五) 書面論文審查評審委員由主辦單位邀請產官學界專家組成，每競賽類組委員3-5名，並得依各類組參賽件數增加評審委員人數；口頭發表評審委員由主辦單位各自推派代表1名組成。擔任參賽論文指導教授者不得兼任評審委員。

(六) 口頭發表時間每人15分鐘，答詢5分鐘，未出席者，視同放棄資格。

(七) 論文及發表以中文或英文為限。

Program Guide

I. Purpose of this Program

Taiwan's national parks are tasked with the crucial mission of preserving and sustaining Taiwan's unique natural and cultural environments and rich biodiversity. Faced with the threat of climate change and increasing need for public participation, it is imperative that we foster more innovative thinking and capable individuals to effectively manage and run our national parks.

The purpose of the National Park Association in Taiwan is to promote academic research relating to national parks along with environmental education and conservation. To this end, we organized the present program to encourage younger generations to get involved in national park conservation and management, encourage innovative thinking, and cultivate new talent and specializations in resource conservation.

VI. Program Description

1. National Park Management Workshop & Youth Forum

The United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) “Vision for 2050” is to “seek a harmonious coexistence between man and nature”. This vision is echoed in the responsibility of national parks toward conservation, recreation, and education, and finding ways to balance these mandates remains an important issue in national park management. This vision also lays the foundation for the subject of our conference: how to manage national parks in a way that effectively promotes a harmonious coexistence between man and nature. Conference participants will visit the Qingtiangang Special Landscape Area to see how national parks are managed and operated first hand, hear a keynote address by researcher emeritus Dr. Lucia Liu Severinghaus of Academia Sinica, and engage in thoughtful discourse on innovative conservation ideas and actions.

2. Graduate Thesis Competition

This competition is open to all current master's degree students, doctoral students, and AY 2020/2021 graduates from any domestic university, college, or junior college who have written a thesis concerning national parks. Accepted submissions will undergo a comprehensive thesis assessment and oral examination, and outstanding submissions will be selected to receive First Place, an Excellence Award, or Honorable Mention along with a cash prize. Upon completion of the event, winning works will be compiled into a thesis anthology, and winners will also be encouraged to submit their work to the Journal of National Park for consideration.

VII. Eligible Participants

1. Park Management Workshop

- (1) Current employees of a national park headquarters age 40 or under, or who joined the national park system within the last 3 years (no age limit).
- (2) Thesis competition entrants (no age limit).
- (3) Members of the general public age 40 or under who have an interest in how national parks are managed and operated.
- (4) Event attendance is limited. If the number of participants exceeds the venue capacity, applicants in categories (1) and (2) above will receive priority access.

2. Graduate Thesis Competition

- (1) Eligibility is open to current master's and doctoral students (including general master's and doctoral programs, international postgraduate programs, and professional master's or doctorate degree programs) and AY 2020/2021 graduates from any university, college, or junior college in Taiwan approved and accredited by the Ministry of Education.
- (2) The research topic and content of the submission must be related to national parks in Taiwan.

- (3) The forum and conference are both open to the general public. Attendance is limited, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.

VIII. Program Schedule and Submission Guidelines

1. Online registration (<http://www.cnps.org.tw/>) must be completed by Saturday, July 31, 2021. Notice of acceptance will be sent to applicants deemed eligible by the Association to participate in the park management workshop and thesis competition.
2. Thesis competition candidates are asked to fill out the attached submission form containing their basic information and merge it with their paper into one (1) PDF file and send to taiwancnps@gmail.com before midnight on the deadline date. Submissions must be received by the deadline in the specified format to be eligible for consideration. Submissions should be sent using the email subject line "National Park Graduate Thesis Competition Submission", and the submitted file should be named using this format (without quotes): "2021NP Thesis_Last Name, First Name". The list of accepted submissions will be announced on Monday, August 16, 2021 on the program website, and accepted participants will be notified by phone.

IX. Thesis Competition Subject Categories:

1. The thesis research subject should fall into one of three categories: (a) Environmental Science; (b) Humanities and Social Sciences; or (c) Management
2. A category must have at least three submissions for it to be included in the competition. If fewer than three submissions are received for a category, the candidate(s) in that category will receive a participation award and a certificate of participation.
3. The organizer may adjust the categories depending on the number of submissions received.

X. Thesis Competition Registration Documents:

1. Basic Information Form.
2. Copy of graduation certificate (for graduates) or copy of student ID (for current students).
3. Unabridged thesis; must be 20 pages or less (see Journal of National Park submission guidelines for formatting requirements).
4. Applicant must be the first author of the submitted paper.

XI. Thesis Competition Selection Criteria:

1. The organizer will review each applicant's registration qualifications. Those who pass the initial screening round will enter the second round consisting of a thesis assessment.
2. Scoring is divided into two parts: "Thesis Assessment" (80% of total score) and "Oral Examination" (20% of total score).
3. To maintain fairness, the thesis assessment will be conducted using a blind peer review process wherein the names of the candidate's school, department, and advisor will not be disclosed.

4. The main scoring criteria are set out below. If two candidates have the same total score, the final winner will be determined based on the Thesis Assessment score. If there is still a tie, the winner will be determined based on the relative importance and contribution their submission has to national park management:

Thesis Assessment (80%)	Oral Examination (20%)
Importance and contribution to national park management (60%)	Presentation performance (50%)
Thesis originality and value (40%)	Q&A session (50%)

5. The Thesis Assessment Committee will comprise 3 to 5 experts from industry, government, and academia for each competition category. The number of committee members may be increased depending on the number of submissions received. Co-organizers will each appoint 1 expert to conduct the Oral Examination review round. Thesis advisors of competition candidates may not serve on any review committee
6. The Oral Examination will consist of one 15-minute presentation per candidate followed by 5 minutes for Q&A. If a candidate does not participate in the Oral Examination, they will automatically forfeit their competition eligibility.
7. Thesis and oral presentation must be in Chinese or English.

1. Winning papers will be compiled into a printed thesis anthology; the organizer may also assist candidates, subject to their consent, with submitting their work to the Journal of National Park for consideration.
2. All submitted papers must be original works created by the submitter and comply with the provisions of the Copyright Act. In the event of copyright infringement, the submitter assumes sole liability and indemnifies and holds harmless the supervisor, organizer, and co-organizer against any and all claims, suits, actions, or liabilities arising therefrom. If a research thesis is found to contain plagiarized content, the submitter's eligibility shall be immediately revoked, and all awards, prizes, and certificates shall be rescinded and recovered.
